
Notes to Remember:



3 You are still worldly. For since there is jealousy and

quarrelling among you, are you not worldly? Are you not

acting like mere humans? 4 For when one says, 'I follow Paul,' and another, 'I follow Apollos,' are you not mere human beings? 5 What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Hopefully, most of you know that part of our being here at St Barnabas is that we serve as Bush Church Aid Field Staff. Hopefully also you know a bit about BCA, maybe you're a BCA supporter – if you are, thank you!

For those who are perhaps unfamiliar with Buch Church Aid and the work it does, I thought it might be helpful to provide a bit of an overview.

BCA began in 1919, when a group of 26 men and women gathered at St Andrews' Cathedral in Sydney to form the Bush Church Aid Society, with the aim of reaching Australia for Christ.

BCA has been involved in ministries such as hostel accommodation, bush hospitals, flying medical services, church planting, chaplaincy, SRE and supporting ministers in church right around Australia.

Today, there are Bush Church Aid Field Staff in 19 of the 23 Anglican Diocese in Australia, working in all manner of ministries. Our slogan is 'going the distance' – that is we will go anywhere, no matter how far, so that people hear about Jesus and are brought into relationship with the living God.

Part of the joy of being Bush Church Aid Field Staff is that the incredible support we receive from people all around Australia. Each month, BCA produces a prayer diary, where each day, particular field staff are prayed for.

We also have 'link churches' – churches that we have a special relationship with and who support us in prayer and encouragement, and who love to hear what God is doing in our church.

Caitlin and I are delighted to be serving as Bush Church Aid Field Staff here at St Barnabas, as together we go the distance for Jesus in our local community.

Do it while you are still together on the way, or your adversary may hand you over to the judge, and the Judge may hand you over to the officer, and you may be thrown into prison. 26 Truly I tell you, you will not get out until you have paid the last penny. 27 'You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery." 28 But I tell you that anyone who looks at a woman lustfully has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 29 If your right eye causes you to stumble, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell. 30 And if your right hand causes you to stumble, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to go into hell. 31 'It has been said, "Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a certificate of divorce." 32 But I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, makes her the victim of adultery, and anyone who marries a divorced woman commits adultery. 33 'Again, you have heard that it was said to the people long ago, "Do not break your oath, but fulfil to the Lord the oaths you have made." 34 But I tell you, do not swear an oath at all: either by heaven, for it is God's throne; 35 or by the earth, for it is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the Great King. 36 And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make even one hair white or black. 37 All you need to say is simply "Yes," be "Yes", and your "No," "No," anything beyond this comes from the evil one.
