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

Romans 4: 1-17

1 What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, discovered in this matter? 2 If, in fact, Abraham was justified by works, he had something to boast about – but not before God. 3 What does Scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.' 4 Now to the one who works, wages are not credited as a gift but as an obligation. 5 However, to the one who does not work but trusts God who justifies the ungodly, their faith is credited as righteousness. 6 David says the same thing when he speaks of the blessedness of the one to whom God credits righteousness apart from works: 7 'Blessed are those whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. 8 Blessed is the one whose sin the Lord will never count against them.' 9 Is this blessedness only for the circumcised, or also for the uncircumcised? We have been saying that Abraham's faith was credited to him as righteousness. 10 Under what circumstances was it credited? Was it after he was circumcised, or before? It was not after, but before! 11 And he received circumcision as a sign, a seal

uncircumcised. So then, he is the father of all who believe but have not been circumcised, in order that righteousness might be credited to them. 12 And he is then also the father of the circumcised who not only are circumcised but who also follow in the footsteps of the faith that our father Abraham had before he was circumcised. 13 It was not through the law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise that he would be heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith. 14 For if those who depend on the law are heirs, faith means nothing and the promise is worthless, 15 because the law brings wrath. And where there is no law there is no transgression. 16 Therefore, the promise comes by faith, so that it may be by grace and may be guaranteed to all Abraham's offspring – not only to those who are of the law but also to those who have the faith of Abraham. He is the father of us all. 17 As it is written: 'I have made you a father of many nations.' He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed – the God who gives life to the dead and calls into being things that were not.

Putting God First

O Lord, my heart is not lifted up, my eyes are not raised too high; I do not occupy myself with things too great and too marvellous for me.

Psalm 131: 1

Pride comes from overvaluing ourselves and undervaluing others. It leads to restlessness of spirit because it makes us dissatisfied with what we have and concerned with what everyone else is doing. It keeps us always hungering for more attention and acclamation.

By contrast, humility puts others first and allows us to be content with God's leading in our lives. Such contentment gives us security so that we no longer have to prove to others. Let humility and trust affect your perspective and give you the strength and freedom to serve God and others who may be in need.

Pride lures us into living independently of God. There is an incompatibility between blind arrogance and the presence of God in our heart. The proud person depends on himself or herself rather than on God.

This causes God's guiding influences to leave his or her life. When God's presence is welcome, there is no room for pride, because he makes us aware of our own true self.

The Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ According to...
Luke 22:39-53

39 Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. 40 On reaching the place, he said to them, "Pray that you will not fall into temptation." 41 He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, 42 "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done." 43 An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. 44 And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground. 45 When he rose from prayer and went back to the disciples, he found them asleep, exhausted from sorrow. 46 "Why are you sleeping?" he asked them. "Get up and pray so that you will not fall into temptation." 47 While he was still speaking a crowd came up, and the man who was called Judas, one of the Twelve, was leading them. He approached Jesus to kiss him, 48 but Jesus asked him, "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss?" 49 When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said, "Lord, should we strike with our swords?" 50 And one of them struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. 51 But Jesus answered, "No more of this!" And he touched the man's ear and healed him. 52 Then Jesus said to the chief priests, the officers of the temple guard, and the elders, who had come for him, "Am I

leading a rebellion, that you have come with swords and clubs? 53 Every day I was with you in the temple courts, and you did not lay a hand on me. But this is your hour—when darkness reigns."

Bible Study Questions

- 1. Is there anything that stood out for you from the passage or the message? New insights?
- 2. Of what is Jesus so afraid? What has caused Jesus so much emotional anguish?
- 3. We see the content of his prayer in v42. What is remarkable about this prayer?
- 4. Judgement is a necessary part of love. How is this the case?
- 5. Drinking the cup of God's wrath is an image of God's anger against evil and God bringing disaster on evil itself. It is this cup Jesus prays will be taken from him. Why is this cup before Jesus at all as one who was completely innocent and sinless?
- 6. Read Isaiah 53:3-6 and see a commentary on the reality of Jesus carrying God's wrath. How do you react to Jesus' willingness to do this for you?
- 7. Why couldn't we just try to be better people nice people; and pray more and go on pilgrimages and love one another more why wouldn't these be effective ways of saving us?
- 8. Do you see why Christians therefore, make exclusive claims about Jesus? (See John 14:6).
- 9. What is the nature of Jesus' fear for us? as seen in his fear for his disciples that night?
- 10. As we walk towards Easter, we are to remember that we walk on the only path that has hope. What are the sorts of things that take us away from or distract us from that path?
- 11. How can we help each other stay on this only path that brings hope and life?
