In brief

Synod began on Friday night, 19 September with a service of Holy Communion in the cathedral with Archbishop Raffel – his second visit to us this year as Metropolitan. You can view his sermon [HERE](#) or listen to the podcast by searching “Bathurst Diocese” wherever you access your podcasts.

Synod passed two lots of legislation: four measures which brought our safe ministry ordinances up to date with state legislation. We adopted a new Ministry Standards Ordinance which deals with clergy and lay people who breach protocols. The second raft of ordinances made further amendments to the Parishes Ordinance and Administration Ordinance. These included matters such as receiving nominations *prior* to an APM, how a chair for parish council is chosen where the minister chooses not to chair; retirement age of clergy, and the bishop licencing lay people to baptise, where appropriate. A memo will be sent explaining the implications of these changes in due course.

Presidential address

Bishop Mark began with the sobering realities of property sales and redress. Church buildings at Binnaway and Stuart Town were closed this year, reflecting population decline and the Diocese's continuing need to fund redress for survivors of abuse.

Appropriately, Bishop Mark then underlined the importance of Safe Ministry training. While compliance feels demanding, he insisted it is non-negotiable so that we might provide a safe environment for all. Currently, fewer than half of all volunteers are compliant. Bishop Mark urged all volunteers to persevere towards compliance.

Bishop Mark reported that the HOPE25 initiative sparked fresh energy across the Diocese, with stories of renewed faith, new families joining churches, greater outward focus, and fruitful evangelistic courses. He linked this with our own vision of *Sharing Jesus for Life*, which continues to shape parish priorities, and inspire creative gospel initiatives.

Acknowledging challenges such as declining volunteer numbers, ageing congregations and buildings, and financial pressures, Bishop Mark nevertheless pointed to clear signs of growth. Bible study groups have doubled since 2019, children's and youth ministries now run in almost half our parishes, clergy numbers have increased, and offertory has risen by 28% since 2021.

Bishop Mark concluded with a call to perseverance: though the work is demanding, God is faithful, and as we keep Christ central and commit to *Sharing Jesus for Life*, we can be confident of his sustaining grace.
